# **EMS Continuing Education Requirements**

Purpose: To provide continuing education requirements for license renewal to Region 6 EMS providers at all levels.

Note: Refer to the Illinois Department of Public Health Rules and Regulations, Section 515.590 EMT License Renewals, for complete requirements.

#### Note: Refer to the 'Core Content Hours" section for a breakdown by content category.

### **Emergency Medical Responder**

- 1. Minimum 24 hours of continuing education per licensure period
- 2. Minimum 6 hours completed per year
- 3. May not exceed 20% of total hours for one subject area
- Current certification in CPR for Healthcare Providers in accordance with the standards of a nationally recognized organization such as the American Heart Association or American Red Cross, which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station.

#### <u>EMT</u>

- 1. Minimum 90 hours of continuing education per licensure period
- 2. Minimum 20 hours completed per year
- 3. May not exceed 20% of total hours for one subject area
- 4. Current certification in CPR for Healthcare Providers in accordance with the standards of a nationally recognized organization such as the American Heart Association or American Red Cross, which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station.

#### **AEMT/EMT-Intermediate**

- 1. Minimum 120 hours of continuing education per licensure period
  - a. Included in the 120 hours:
    - i. Attend an Advanced Skill Review annually
    - ii. Maintain current ACLS certification (which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station)
    - iii. Maintain current PALS or PEPP certification (which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station)
    - iv. Maintain current ITLS or PHTLS certification as per system requirement
- 2. Minimum 25 hours completed per year
- 3. May not exceed 20% of total hours for one subject area
- 4. Current certification in CPR for Healthcare Providers in accordance with the standards of a nationally recognized organization such as the American Heart Association or American Red Cross, which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station.

### **Paramedic**

- 1. Minimum 120 hours of continuing education per licensure period
  - a. Included in the 120 hours:
    - i. Attend an Advanced Skill Review annually
    - ii. Maintain current ACLS certification (which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station)
    - iii. Maintain current PALS or PEPP certification (which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station
    - iv. Maintain current ITLS or PHTLS certification as per system requirement
- 2. Minimum 25 hours completed per year

- 3. May not exceed 20% of total hours for one subject area
- 4. Current certification in CPR for Healthcare Providers in accordance with the standards of a nationally recognized organization such as the American Heart Association or American Red Cross, which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station.

## Prehospital Registered Nurse

- 1. Minimum 120 hours of continuing education per licensure period
  - a. Included in the 120 hours:
    - i. Attend an Advanced Skill Review annually
    - ii. Maintain current ACLS certification (which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station)
    - iii. Maintain current PALS, PEPP or ENPC certification (which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station)
    - iv. Maintain current ITLS, PHTLS, TNS or TNCC certification as per system requirement
- 2. Minimum 25 hours completed per year
- 3. May not exceed 20% of total hours for one subject area
- 4. Current certification in CPR for Healthcare Providers in accordance with the standards of a nationally recognized organization such as the American Heart Association or American Red Cross, which includes both a didactic and clinical skills station
- 5. Is a Registered Professional Nurse in accordance with the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act

# **Emergency Communications Registered Nurse**

- 1. Minimum 32 hours of continuing education per licensure period
- 2. Is a Registered Professional Nurse in accordance with the Nursing and Advanced Practice Nursing Act

#### EMS Lead Instructor

- 1. Minimum 10 hours of continuing education **annually** 
  - Programs used to fulfill other professional continuing education requirements, i.e., EMT, nursing, may also be used to meet this requirement.
- 2. Attendance at a Department-approved curriculum review course, if applicable
- A letter of support from an EMS Medical Director indicating that the EMS Lead Instructor has satisfactorily coordinated programs for the EMS System at any time during the fouryear period.

#### **Emergency Medical Dispatcher**

1. Minimum 12 hours **annually** of medical dispatch continuing education
