### Landing Zone:

Landing zone is to be determined by prevailing service as should flight decision unless there is significant trauma.

Provide 911 dispatch center with a cell phone number call back and speak to you directly for patient information if needed.

Request LifeStar Ambulance call you directly for directions, patient updates and for a flight decision.

## Intercept Location / Requesting Transport

<b>911 Requests</b>	When calling for a transport, make sure you request an INTERCEPT. Requesting an ambulance like a 911 caller will trigger first responders that you may not need on site. You are an Ambulance service requesting an INTERCEPT. Avoid words like extrication, motorcycle crash etc. Provide injury details and your intercept location and what you need. Request First Responders only if you need extra hands for a major trauma or multiple patients.
<b>Intercept Location</b>	Intercept with LifeStar Ambulance near the entrance of the property.

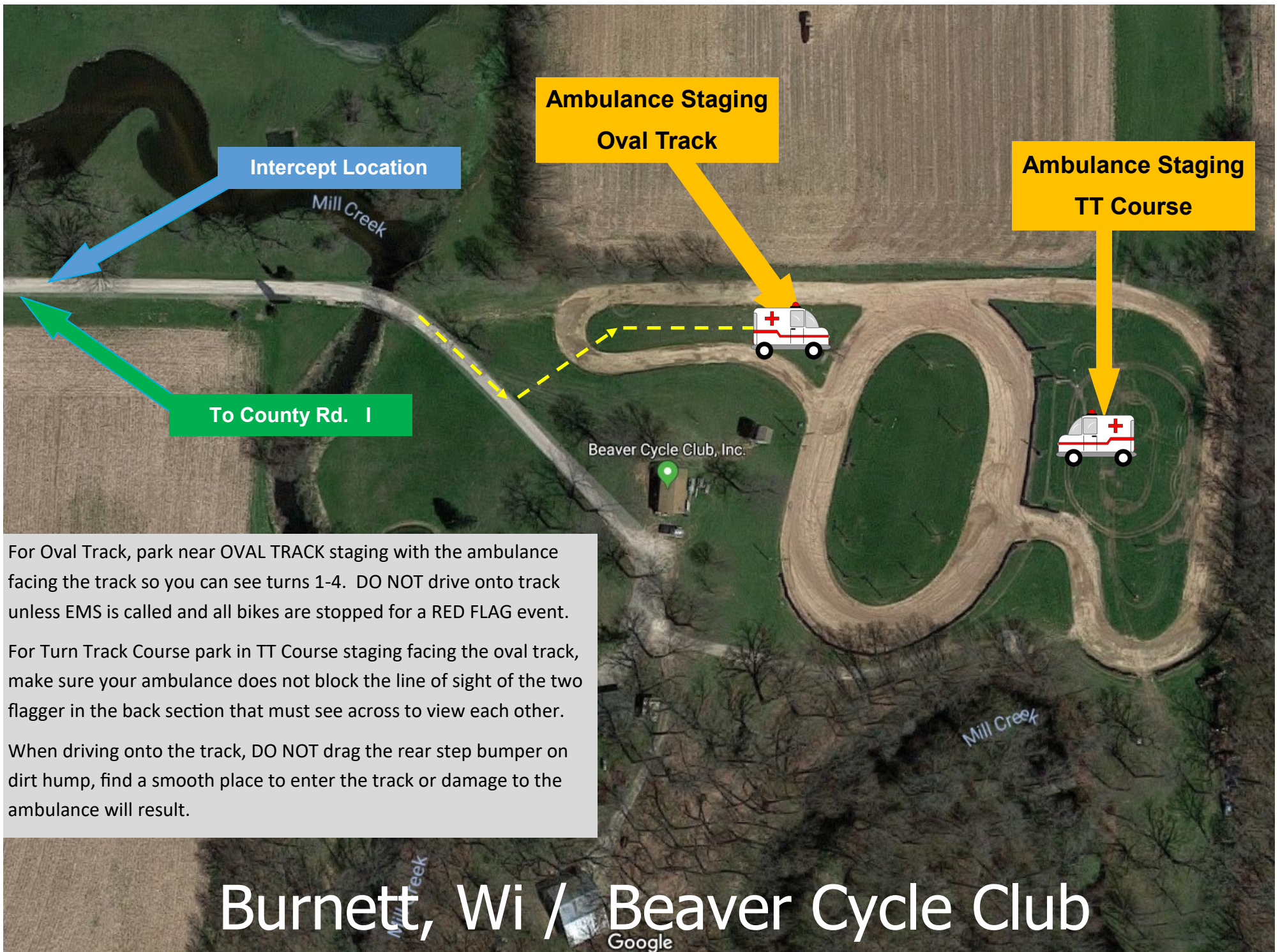
## Venue Safety Rules:

Unknown unless otherwise enforced the club membership.

## Venue Communications / Staging:

Direct communication with track crew via their radio's

Stage where appropriate or directed to, use common sense! Visibility is key at this high speed venue.



For Oval Track, park near OVAL TRACK staging with the ambulance facing the track so you can see turns 1-4. DO NOT drive onto track unless EMS is called and all bikes are stopped for a RED FLAG event.

For Turn Track Course park in TT Course staging facing the oval track, make sure your ambulance does not block the line of sight of the two flagger in the back section that must see across to view each other.

When driving onto the track, DO NOT drag the rear step bumper on dirt hump, find a smooth place to enter the track or damage to the ambulance will result.
